SPRINGFIELD--June 15, 2017--If you know a young golfer, the Lincoln Land Charity Championship's Junior Clinic is a perfect place for him or her to learn more about golf. The clinic starts at 2 p.m., Tues., June 20, and tour professionals will be there to give tips and later sign autographs. "It's important for youth to be involved in golf and see it up close," said Lincoln Land Charity Championship Executive Director Kate Peters. "It's the kind of sport that you can play your entire life. It opens doors in the professional world. And it's fun. We want more youngsters to appreciate and play golf."

The tournament will give a gift pack to each participating youngster. In addition, admission to the tournament is free for kids age 16 and under when accompanied by a ticketed adult.

The Lincoln Land Charity Championship will consist of a 156-player field, competing for a purse of \$550,000 at Panther Creek Country Club in Springfield. The 7,244-yard golf course was designed by World Golf Hall of Fame Member Hale Irwin in 1992. The course has hosted several notable tournaments including the LPGA's State Farm Classic from 2007-2011 and last year hosted the NCAA Division II Super Regionals and the Great Lakes Valley Conference Golf Championship.
